The candidates for ICC (Canada) Vice-President were: Lisa Qiluqqi Koperqualuk, Sheila Lumsden

Following the election, the new ICC (Canada) President for the 2018-2022 term is Monica Ell-Kanayuk.

The new ICC (Canada) Vice-President for the 2018-2022 term is Lisa Koperqualuk.

Outgoing ICC (Canada) President Nancy Karetak-Lindell thanked all candidates for running in the election for the two positions, which have terms of four years each.
